Dear parents,

With the departure of the boarders we have finally come to the end of the academic year. It has been a long year and it has had its share of joys and sorrows, problems and challenges. What remains to be done now is to tie up the loose ends, get the corrections completed and the results posted. The school is quiet now and winter is settling in. The servants are busy cleaning up and clearing up. As usual there are piles of clothes and books and stationery items carelessly left behind. This year all the material left behind is being collected and donated to the children of a very poor village near Abu Road. Earlier on in the year we had made contact with the children of this village as part of an outreach program connected with the bicentenary celebrations of our founder Edmund Rice.

As you know our biggest problem for next year will be water as the drought is much worse than the one that we had a couple of years ago.

As a result the following changes have been made in the school schedule. You are requested to make a careful note of the following.

## REOPENING OF SCHOOL

For the boys of classes 4, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 10 school will reopen on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> February 2003. As a result the Bombay and Delhi Parties will depart on the 13<sup>th</sup> of February 2003. In order to make some space in the school for the boys appearing for their ICSE exams to study and prepare the boys of class 7 are being asked to come later. School will reopen for the boys of CLASS 7 on Saturday the 8<sup>th</sup> of March 2003. The Bombay and Delhi parties for class 7 boys will leave on 5<sup>th</sup> March 2003.

### **BOY'S APPEARING FOR ICSE 2003**

**Boarders appearing for the ICSE exam in March 2003 are to return to school on the 10<sup>th</sup> of February 2003.** Under normal circumstances they would have had the whole school to themselves for around 2 weeks with plenty of peace and quiet to study before school started. This time they will have to make the best of the changed circumstances. Despite the best efforts of all the teachers concerned at least 10 candidates have failed in their second prelim exams. They appear to be headed for disaster in their ICSE exams unless they do some serious study in the holidays.
